hen asked how it feels to be the sole extant founding member of one of Taiwan's most mutable bands, Cheer Hsieh (謝青 翰), one half of electronica duo KbN (凱比鳥), waxed philosophical. "It's a Zen spirit," he said. "I go with the ups and downs. If a change can let things move in a specific direction, then there

isn't anything wrong with it." KbN, whose lineup at one point comprised 11 members, has been a mainstay in the independent music scene for more than a decade, and has moved through a succession of genres, from punk rock to trip-hop and now experimental electronica.

Yet the same independent DIY punk rock ethic that characterized the band's humble beginnings continues to fuel its future aspirations.

"It [Taiwan's music scene] is getting better. I mean at least we can get more information about things, and more people can accept this new stuff, [and] are willing to try new sounds," said Hsieh. "The artist is free to do more."

The group, whose current lineup consists of Hsieh and Jerry Fang (方宜正), aka Jez, has been taking full advantage of that freedom. Its songs are often built on sound textures rather than obvious melodic components. The music isn't in the notes, it's in the way the noises and rhythms rub against each other to create moods.

KbN plays tomorrow night in Taipei at Hook



as part of City Sounds #4, and appears along with 40 other local acts at next weekend's Freak Out Da Beast (吵年獸) festival, which Hsieh and Fang had a hand in organizing.

Born free

KbN made headlines two years ago as the first Taiwanese act to play at the South by Southwest festival in Austin, Texas. A couple of years before that, the band's song Urge (衝動) received a Golden Horse Award nomination for best original song for Hou Hsiao-hsien's (侯孝賢) film Three Times (最好的時光), and was on the sound track to Yao Hung-I's (姚宏易) film Reflections (愛麗絲的鏡 子). The group has also contributed work for *The* Bean (美人胚子), directed by Wang Mei-jung (王梅 蓉) and Luo Chiao-mei (駱巧梅).

The band is working on two animated shorts with college students for their graduate projects. and is teaming up with painter Chen Ching-Yuan (陳敬元), also known as WANWOR, on a remix EP scheduled for release in March and a concept album due out in the summer, both based on his paintings.

"There is already a story in a film, so we just try to add emotion to follow the story," said Fang. "But with a still image, you have to imagine the story. We're using sound to make a story to match the image."

The fruits of KbN's collaboration with Malaysian graffiti artist Bobo will go on display next month at Asiaworld Shopping Mall (環亞購物中 心) in Taipei as part of The Message 777, an event that pairs independent bands with artists and is sponsored by French clothing brand Agnes B.

"I think our generation happened to have this freedom and passion to do what we want to and to see what we are really capable of, and to try to reach places our moms and dads never dreamed of," said Hsieh. "And if we're lucky, we may make a living out of it."

KbN was the first Taiwanese band to play at the South by

What's in a name?

here's something a little dishonest about Volar, the recently opened club that occupies the space Plush used to at Core Pacific City Living Mall (京華城). For one, Volar in Taipei shares the same moniker as a respected club brand that operates a branch in Hong Kong (named best club in the Special Administrative Region by *Time Out* for two years in a row) and Shanghai, but the two, says the former's director of marketing, have no connection.

Think of it as the clubbing world's equivalent of a Taiwanese company launching a tablet computer and calling it an iPad.

The Vinyl Word checked out the nightspot's weekly Wednesday bash, Rocks the Rabbit Party, which according to the bumph promised "sexy rabbit girls": But no fluffy tails, and no bucktoothed females. Hopefully they didn't come down with myxomatosis before they were due to make an appearance.

Lockers outside the entrance are an extortionate NT\$50 a pop; a companion ordered a vodka and cranberry juice and received a vodka and Red Bull, and paid NT\$300 for the privilege; and the music — Rumpshaker by Wreckxn-Effect and Mama Said Knock You Out by LL Cool J spoke more about what type of clientele the club is aiming for than the decor, which riffed on a theme of nondescript lounge bar chic — black plastic candelabra, red neon strip lighting, and what looked like a fly loft suspended from the ceiling above the bar with black and white fabric draped around the batons.

At midnight, a quick headcount ascertained that the sparse crowd totaled about 70 persons.

Still, it's early days yet. Rolled out in December, Volar threw its grand opening do on Saturday of last week, and the rent-a-celebrities came out in force, including funnyman and variety show host Jacky Wu (吳宗憲).

The music policy is hip-hop and house. On the same floor, Asia, which also opened last month, in the space that Party Room once occupied, is a drink-allyou-can affair that focuses on hip-hop.

The two new clubs face stiff competition. Attendance at Luxy on Wednesday night in the newly refurbished Onyx Room, now named Pulse, for the club's monthly party thrown by **Noodles** and **Mykal** was about 30 percent capacity, while the Galleria was rammed. And then there's Room 18.
