The mad rush starts this weekend as everyone heads home for the Lunar New Year holiday, which runs nine days this year. If traveling, save yourself the headache of driving in heavy traffic and take buses and trains where possible.

For those making last-minute plans, the Tourism Bureau advises that train and bus tickets are often fully booked on Lunar New Year's Eve and the first day of the Lunar New Year, which fall tomorrow and Sunday, respectively. Whether you're driving or using public transportation, expect large crowds and traffic delays all next week, especially at major scenic areas around the country.

Before heading out, you can see how big the crowds will be at tourist hot spots. The Tourism Bureau's Scenic Spot Alert System (tourspots. tbroc.gov.tw/land/trvplc_opn.asp), a Web site (in Chinese only) that gets updated every few hours, posts the number of visitors at over a dozen major attractions including Taipei 101, Sun Moon Lake (日月潭), and Kending (墾丁). There's even a tourist "forecast" for the entire week: The Web site estimates that the National Palace Museum will see around 3,000 people on Sunday, the first day of the Lunar New Year, with attendance peaking on Wednesday with more than 5,000 visitors.

For Taipei residents who don't want to travel far, most major shopping areas, movie theaters and museums will remain open. For day trips or overnight getaways, hot springs resorts in Yangmingshan and Wulai offer respite from the cold weather that usually arrives at this time of year.

Note that tomorrow is Lunar New Year's Eve, which means that shops and stores will close early, usually around 5pm or 6pm. Some bus lines will run reduced services, but the MRT will follow its normal schedule for the entire holiday.
