Convicted of:
Embezzling public assets, forgery, money laundering, abusing public office to illegally acquire assets

First ruling:
Life imprisonment, NT\$200 million (US\$6.2 million) fine, lifelong deprivation of citizen rights

Second ruling:
20-year sentence, NT\$170 million fine, deprivation of citizen rights for 10 years

Wu Shu-jen
(former first lady)

Convicted of:
Embezzling public assets, taking bribes, forgery, money laundering, abusing public office to illegally acquire assets

First ruling:
Life imprisonment, NT\$300 million fine, lifelong deprivation of citizen rights

Second ruling:
